SGVV believes in the integrated development of community members, including the poor, marginalized, vulnerable, disadvantaged groups, minorities, and tribals of Jharkhand.



In this reporting year, SGVV focused on women's empowerment and child rights & protection. The organization firmly believes that without economic empowerment, we cannot envision real empowerment for women in our society. Therefore, we organized and promoted livelihoods through agriculture and allied activities among the tribal community of the Khunti block.

Secondly, we raised awareness among the community regarding Covid vaccination, which was a ray of hope for saving lives. There were misconceptions among the community members about Covid vaccination, and our team worked tirelessly to mobilize and educate the community for vaccination.

We were deeply concerned about children's rights and protection, working to prevent child trafficking and ensure safe migration in Khunti district. Recognizing Khunti as a tribal-dominant area with high migration rates among girls and women, we endeavoured to create awareness about safe migration and child labour protection. We successfully organized panchayat, block, and district-level programs, creating awareness through Nuked Natak, campaigns, and the distribution of pamphlets and posters in villages.

Additionally, we successfully collaborated with government programs, benefiting many individuals through PM Rural Housing schemes, MNREGA, Social Security Schemes, etc.

Lastly, but not least, my sincere thanks to our donors and funding agencies who have provided financial support and faith in us. I extend my gratitude to the community members and beneficiaries for their full coordination and cooperation. Special thanks to our board members, organizational staff, and volunteers who have consistently offered their time and guidance. We will strive to increase our accessibility to reach a greater number of people with new development initiatives in the future.

Gneiss of organization:

Sinduartola Gramodaya Vikas Vidyalaya (SGVV) was established in 1975 as a non-profit, non-political, secular voluntary organization to serve the poor community living in subhuman condition. The children of these communities were either engaged in rag picking or worked as bonded child labour. There were no concern for the education and wellbeing of the children with proper education. SGVV started with a small learning centre for the children of the destitute community. Later, SGVV was registered as a legal entity under Society Registration Act 21-1860 in the year 1978. It also started working with marginalized people to improve their education quality, health care and income generation.

In the year 1998, SGVV established a field office in a village located in Rania Block. It started community development activities in the rural areas of Rania Block of Khunti district, Jharkhand. Subsequently SGVV focused its efforts primarily on agriculture and food security, inequities for people with disabilities, women's empowerment, child trafficking, family counseling and education for girl's child who discontinued education and dropped out and children who are out of school. It also started crèches for the small children of age 1-6 years and mainstreamed them to the formal education.

SGVV's main concentrated work still focuses in Rania and Khunti Blocks of Khunti district as its main intervention area.

Vision:

- To establish an egalitarian society where every individual has the opportunity to thrive within a supportive and inclusive community.

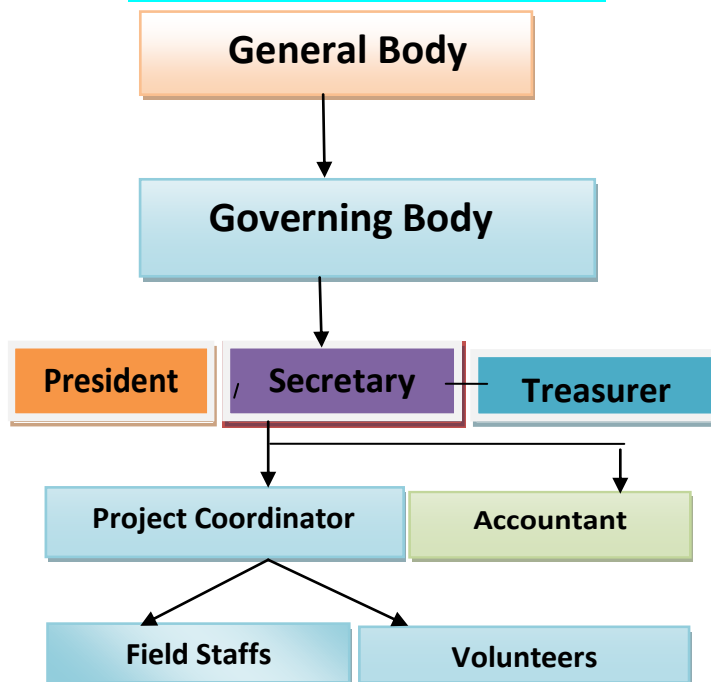
Mission:

- Education and well developed society based on justice and humane feelings where the local natural resources are best utilized.

Objectives of the organization:

- To assist and work for the cultural, intellectual and moral development without any discrimination on the basis of caste, religion or community
- Physical mental and moral development of the boys and girls and their cultural development
- To establish the school, handicrafts centres, cottage industries, small industries for making the women, particularly the poor and helpless women, self-dependent and making arrangements for the training.
- To make arrangements for the extension, propagation and exhibition of the education related to music, singing and drawing arts.
- To impart better education through the school, high schools, study centre and the libraries.
- To make efforts for providing health facilities in the remote and scheduled places where people need them
- To make steps in the direction of protecting and preserving the natural environment
- To work for disabled, divorced and deserted women, widows and orphans and eliminate corruption, social evils and exploitation of the vulnerable communities
- To run stay homes for the working women, Crèche and Balwadi
- To rehabilitate displaced person, child labors, trafficked girls and help them getting their rights and opportunities
- To establish community based organizations, self help groups and network with small non government organization and helping them with financial assistance, micro credits from the government for their self sustenance
- To offer consultation to the affected people from various civil issues
- To create resources in the rural and urban areas on drinking water, literacy, education, environmental conservation, food security
- To conduct research on social and economic issues

Basanti Devi, aged 35, resides with her husband, Fagu Gope, in the village of Tuttoli, Panchayat – Tilra, in the Khunti block of the Khunti district. Both of them are primarily engaged in daily wage labour and currently live in a rented house in the village, as their original home was demolished due to heavy rain. They do not have any children.

Basanti learned about the organization's work from her neighbour and attended a meeting with other women. The organization's staff motivated her to become a member of the Self-Help Group (SHG), similar to other women in the village. During the meeting, the lady worker informed her about government programs such as the Aushman card, MNREGA, PM Rural Housing Schemes, etc.

Facing significant need, Basanti applied for a house under the PM Rural Housing Schemes, but her application was initially rejected. In the subsequent attempt, our project staff provided support and resubmitted the application with the necessary documents. After six months, she received an allotment and successfully constructed a two-room house.

Now, she is overjoyed to have a home under the PM Rural Housing Schemes, thanks to the support of the organization's staff. Basanti now lives peacefully in her new home and expresses gratitude to SGVV for this invaluable assistance.

WOMEN EMPOWERMENT

Empowering women has a positive impact not only on women themselves but also on families, communities, and societies as a whole. It contributes to sustainable development, social justice, and the achievement of diverse global goals. Efforts towards women's empowerment require a comprehensive and collaborative approach involving governments, non-governmental organizations, businesses, and individuals. Sinduarta Gramodaya Vikas Vidyalaya (SGVV) has a focused women's empowerment program in Khunti district. Women and adolescent girls are organized through the formation of Self-Help Group (SHG) groups, and there is a linkage with credit facilities and livelihood promotion activities. The program informs women about government programs and their associated benefits. SGVV also educates women about their rights



and entitlements. The organization promotes education among adolescent girls and advocates for good health for all. Discussions also include topics such as safe migration and providing a helpline number to protect individuals from

trafficking cases.

Till date, SGVV has formed more than 70 women's SHG groups and 12 groups for adolescent girls in Raniya and Khunti blocks of Khunti district. There are more than 5000 members in these groups, and they have developed a supportive system to help and support each other. Women are resolving social issues such as domestic violence, atrocities, women exploitation, gender-based violence, and discrimination. They regularly organize group meetings to discuss these social issues.

CELEBRATION INTERNATIONAL BIO DIVERSITY DAY

Biodiversity, short for biological diversity, refers to the variety of life on Earth at all levels of biological organization, including the diversity of species, ecosystems, and genetic diversity within species. It is a measure of the variety of living organisms present in different ecosystems, as well as the ecological roles they perform and the genetic diversity they contain.

With the support of ASAR New Delhi, SGVV actively participated in a network of five NGOs in Jharkhand and celebrated International Biodiversity Day in Ranchi. The group of NGOs communicated about the importance of biodiversity and shared tips on preserving the vegetation nearby where we live. The organizations jointly started the campaign and created awareness among community people regarding biodiversity.

LIVELIHOOD PROMOTION PROGRAM

Livelihood refers to the means by which individuals and households secure the basic necessities of life, including food, water, shelter, clothing, and other essential needs. Livelihoods encompass the capabilities, assets, and activities required for people to earn a living and support their well-being. Livelihood strategies vary widely across different regions, cultures, and socioeconomic contexts. The primary purpose of a livelihood is to generate income for individuals and families to meet their basic needs and improve their quality of life. This income can come from various sources, including employment, self-employment, and entrepreneurial activities.

SGVV promoted livelihood among the community by initiating various programs. Various training programs were organized on livelihood, focusing on mushroom cultivation, collection of forest produce, vegetable cultivation, agriculture promotion, fruit plantation, and linking with government programs like MNREGA. These initiatives aimed to promote livelihoods among tribal families in the Khunti district. Vegetable cultivation and low-cost farming techniques proved effective in reducing input costs and increasing farmers' income. Most of the program beneficiaries were women. The organization also collaborated with government programs, helping farmers construct farm ponds and engage in vegetable farming. The promotion of sustainable livelihoods has contributed to a reduction in migration in this area.



HEALTH AWARENESS PROGRAM

The phrase "health is wealth" encapsulates the idea that good health is one of the most valuable assets a person can possess. This saying emphasizes the importance of prioritizing and investing in one's health, as it is foundational to overall well-being and a fulfilling life.

Women and child health is a major focus of the organization. The organization conducts health awareness

programs on health and hygiene among SHG women and adolescent girls. General health and seasonal diseases, along with a balanced diet, are important for maintaining good health. Information regarding immunization, iron tablets, incorporating vegetables into dietary habits, etc., is imparted during training. Reproductive health issues, including RTI/STI/UTI/HIV/AIDS, are also covered in the program.

Aushman Bharat is one of the major government programs designed to provide good health to the poor



and marginalized community. Many group members and community people have enrolled in the program, and some have used the card for their treatment. The organization has created awareness in the community and supported people in enrolling in the program.

The organization organized a Covid awareness program in the community regarding Covid vaccination in Khunti district. People were very confused about vaccination, and there was a

lack of interest. The organization distributed pamphlets and informed people about vaccination.



STRENGTHEN THE PRI

Gram Swaraj was the dream of our Father of the Nation, Mahatma Gandhi. He wanted to establish local governance in villages, with villagers fully involved in all the development processes of the village. SGVV organized a capacity-building program for the community regarding the importance of Gram Sabha and the role of PRI in the development of the village and panchayat. After the training of SGVV, the participation of people has increased, especially among women. Women are presenting their demands in front of the Panchayat.



TRAFFICKING AND SAFE MIGRATION

Human trafficking is a serious violation of human rights and is considered a form of modern-day slavery. Jharkhand is one of the states where a large number of women and adolescent girls are caught by traffickers every year. Girls are particularly vulnerable to trafficking for various purposes, including forced

labor, sexual exploitation, and use in armed conflict. SGVV has organized many awareness programs to create awareness among the tribal community regarding safe migration and the registration process in the labor department before going outside. They inform about the helpline number and suggest informing



their family about the employer and the place they are going. As per data, 98% of tribal women and girls in Jharkhand are trapped by traffickers. SGVV organized training among groups, nuked natak, wall writing, and created awareness among the women SHG.

SGVV also organized block and district-level workshops on safe migration and stopping human trafficking in Khunti district. The program invited lawyers and panchayat people to inform about

the legal support to victims and provide helpline numbers.

AGRICULTURE PROMOTION PROGRAM

To support the fight against poverty and ensure that people have food security, it is vital to modernize the agriculture sector. Agriculture is the most important sector of the Indian economy. The Indian agriculture sector accounts for 18 percent of India's gross domestic product (GDP) and provides employment to 50% of the country's workforce. India is the world's largest producer of pulses, rice, wheat, spices, and spice products. India has emerged as the second-largest producer of fruits and vegetables in the world. However, at the same time, our farmers' condition is very vulnerable. Poor infrastructure, traditional agricultural practices, high investment costs, and uncertainty of rains directly affect agriculture. Farmers are abandoning agriculture and migrating to big cities for other livelihoods.

SGVV organized an agriculture promotion program for the tribal community in Khunti. The program informed farmers about modern farming practices and how they can increase their productivity by using modern farming techniques, growing market-based crops. The organization also developed farmers' groups in villages and introduced kitchen gardens and vegetable cultivation for their livelihoods. The program aimed to promote higher income from agriculture and reduce migration from this area.

NATIONAL CHILD LABOUR PROGRAM

The term 'child labour' is often defined as work that deprives children of their childhood, their potential, and their dignity and that is harmful to physical and mental development. The worst forms of child labour involve children being enslaved, separated from their families, exposed to serious hazards and illnesses, and/or left to fend for themselves on the streets of large cities—often at a very early age.

SGVV organized a program to stop child labour in Khunti district. The organization created an awareness program among the community through nukkad natak, campaigns, public meetings, school intervention programs, wall writings, etc.

CELEBRATION OF INTERNATIONAL WOMEN 'S DAY

SGVV celebrated International Women's Day on 15th March in Khunti among the group of women in the federation, with more than 100 women participating in the program. The event provided an opportunity for women to express their views and thoughts regarding women's issues in society. The entire day was dedicated to discussions on the improvement and empowerment of women. Women shared their experiences and discussed how they can support each other. The organization aims to develop a support system among women to assist those in need, ensuring that no one dares to commit abuse against women and girls.



PROGRAM FOR DIFFERENTLY ABLE PEOPLE

Disability is not a curse for differently-abled people. A disability is any condition that makes it more difficult for a person to engage in certain activities or interact with the world around them. Approximately 3-5% of the total population in India are suffering from any type of disability. A total of 32 types of disabilities are mentioned in our New Act of Disability Rights 2016. The new Act provides full opportunities to enjoy rights such as health, education, vocational training, and self-employment for disabled persons without any discrimination.

SGVV organized a program for people with disabilities, informing them about certification and enrolment under government programs and benefits in Khunti district. The program also supported people with disabilities in livelihood promotion.
